# Deprovisioning


#### Definition

Deprovisioning - removing the ability for someone to access resources when something changes and they should not have access (previously could)

This is not the opposite of "provisioning" which is creating and syncing accounts and access from an identity management component (e.g. Sailpoint) to another system (related but not directly opposite)


## Composite group

Simple deprovisioning - though issue re-entering intake



#### **Attestation**

- Reminder to review
- Not instantaneous
- Mitigated by composite
- People ignore these
- Attestation with teeth?
  - Disable group is not attested regularly



#### Rule to remove

- Rule to remove members if condition not met (e.g. not an employee)

- Might be in error (e.g. contracting status erroneously ends)
- Need to go back through intake process to fix
  - I.e. someone add back to group

#### Rule for grace period


- Rule to set disabled date for members if condition not met (e.g. not an employee)

- Email group manages to review access
