


"Forging strong relationships is essential to success.


Which of the Top 10 Issues has the most impact for your Architecture Practice (choose up to 3). 10 responses



Which of the Top 10 Issues are you working on at your institution? (choose up to 3).




Which of the Top 10 Issues are you working on at your institution? (choose up to 3).





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
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
Managing cost, risk, and value of investments in new ERP solutions

Strong leadership and the ability to adapt to change are essential at present.

People and relationships are key to long term success.

Leadership needs to evolve to understand the whole enterprise system and how change impacts the system.

The leadership (in the sense of being able to surface and navigate the right conversations, founded with the right evidence, bringing voice-of-customer to bear, introducing the changing landscape and longer-term planning horizons) is completely essential for the practice of enterprise architecture in higher education, and we cannot have the "ultra intelligent institution" or "everything is anywhere" without bringing the institution along on the journey, together, through the difficult conversations and the ability to deliver change in difficult times.

I spend a great deal of effort on developing the planning and leadership capability of service team leads. In short, working with them to move their relationships to the "right" seat at the table.



As an Architect...which of these are you working on?

- My highest priority is claiming and securing my seat at the leadership table it is important to show value, and understand how my practice can benefit [the CIO] and the organization as it evolves.
- Working on getting a seat at the table, being the bridge between business objectives and technology.
- Gathering **information and creating views** that can be used to influence our strategy and direction.
- The architectural role I was hired for was to support the implementation of the university strategy and this means developing institution-wide relationships and artifacts that support better decision making.
- I believe working on Issue #1. A **Seat at the Table** will provide downstream positive impacts on all the other issues.
- It's really that _cluster_ of top-ten issues that is triggered by #7 (use of data) for #4 (experience) using #10 (cloud) in an environment packed with #3 (talent and potential) to deliver a new university and a new higher-education experience #9 (online), which can only happen with #1 (seat at the table).
- I am working through my relationships to have the opportunity to weigh in on the future strategy capability at my University. I am working to do the same in our own practice. Developing less experienced colleagues... I am working to engage design thinkers in a broader and deeper conversation about our architecture and opportunities for large improvement.
