

## Identity Assurance Profiles Refined



The InCommon Technical Advisory Committee and identity managers from several campuses have worked the last several

months to clarify and simplify the requirements for the Bronze and Silver Assurance Profiles, which will soon be finalized. Two groups of campuses — one from the CIC and one from SURA — are working together on the Silver adoption process.

At the same time, InCommon has applied to the U.S. government's Identity, Credential and Access Management (ICAM) program to become a Trust Framework Provider, simplifying interaction with government applications that require higher levels of assurance. ## Metadata Enhancements on Tap



A series of planned metadata enhancements will be deployed after the Spring Member Meeting. First up are metadata

elements that call out the individual attribute requirements of service providers. The near-term plan includes metadata extension elements for user interfaces, including logos, display names and descriptions, and URLs to external resources such as Privacy Policy documents. Together these new elements will enable user consent of attribute release.
