Davidson County Community College (DCCC)

Davie County Schools (DCS) K-12 – Early College High School Program

Pilot Scope:

Two IdPs serving 16,000 (DCCC) and 15,000 (DCS) students

Small number of local SPs (initially) serving both communities

<u>Initial Pilot Goals</u>: (benefits and desired outcomes)

Primarily to provide a Case Study for the Early College High School program that can be used as another value proposition for the Community College system to encourage adoption of federated identity management. Of course there will be immediate benefit to both DCCC and DCS.

Targeted start and end dates for initial pilot:

Target start date was the beginning of the 2013 fall term at DCCC; however, competing demands for time and new versions of software delayed the installation of DCCC's IdP. The IdP should be installed by the end of the calendar year, with some SPs also available in this same timeframe. End dates for the pilot (full production) will hopefully be prior to the summer term.

Post-pilot longer-term goals: (plans for expansion)

Longer-term goals are to have all LEAs and Charter Schools federated by fall of 2014 through North Carolina's Race to the Top funded NCEdCloud IAM service.

Hopefully, the same timeframe would apply for all Community Colleges in North Carolina; however, there are currently no plans/projects to move forward.

Federation model selected for project:

For the time being a standard InCommon model will be used. Once a Regional/InCommon business model can be established, some form of this new model will likely be used.

Targeted applications or cloud services: (Canvas, InBloom, internal, etc.)

For the pilot the initial SP/Application will be the Student Portal at DCCC. Other SPs will follow, with a focus on those used by K-12 Early College HS Program students.
