
Why?


- Provide an easy way for both initiative owners and the EASG to align efforts with our future architectural goals and structure.

- Provide a single point of reference to distributed roadmaps and future state documents and their stewards.


It focuses on measures in the following areas:

- Business Alignment
- User Impact & Usability
- Information and Data Architecture
- Technical architecture
- Risk management

What does the future look like?

- Sponsors and stakeholders review the principles and find the appropriate Scorecard metrics at the earliest stages of an initiative.
- They reach out to the Scorecard metric stewards to help align their effort to the future vision.
- As the initiative moves forward, the Project Review Board measures the effort against the Scorecard.

What do we gain?

- Because of early alignment and realignment, initiatives slowly drive us towards our desired future state.
- We understand the technical/architectural debt we are taking on when we choose to go against the Scorecard.
- Our architectural goals are met more quickly and holistically which allows us to be more agile and operate more efficiently and transparently.
