

- Personal "cheerleaders"


Follow your instincts, including living your values

My Original Life Plan...from the beginning






Plan your life to achieve your purpose ... Your Life Lines

Life Lines: Plan and project the general timing of your life goals


- Work: Career goals and milestones

Key Learnings


There are many speed bumps in life...we all have them

Follow your instincts


- If it doesn't feel right, it's not ... don't be afraid to walk away
