Status Updates

1. eduroam-US TAC charter(Mike Z, Rob C, Nick R)

- Nick started with InCommon TAC charter to create this new eduroam charter . Comments are welcome. Interested in CACTI thoughts about the type of people we want to recruit. TAC has recently focused on service providers and commercial partners such as Unicon.
- Question on how this eduroam TAC will "report up"
- **AI Nick will add to the eduroam TAC charter an explanation of the need for this eduroam TAC**
- Nick will research whether there are counterparts to this eduroam TAC in other regions/continents
- ChrisP says yes in European CON federation, there is one document and one group and a lot of governance. Good example of being very specific about service. 103 countries involved. Latin CON federation
- Chris will provide a link for the above
- Question of whether North American eduroam should follow the framework of the CONs
- Heterogeneity of practice should be kept in mind
- Suggestion to move the word "TAC" towards front
- Important to be sure we are prepared for security attacks, weather events, and other scenarios
